Health Notes from Fay Wilson

Let's Get the "Scoop" on Salt

Today I joined some friends from church for brunch. It turned out to be a fascinating experience, an eye opener on salt and tastes.

I saw salt being added to omelets, boiled eggs, tomatoes, potatoes, and even on eggs Benedict. When I got home, I dug out a recent *Chicago Tribune* article on salt from my recycle bag.

Come to find out, the amount of salt (sodium chloride) that is safe for us has been studied and researched for over a century! And it's very doubtful that it will be resolved in the near future.

Study after study on linking salt consumption with health issues found conflicting results. I read that over 100 million Americans have high blood pressure, a disorder that increases the risk of heart attacks and strokes. For many people this risk is made worse by eating too much salt.

The typical American diet has more sodium levels than the American Heart Association recommends for healthy people. It is double the daily amount of 1,500 milligrams that the association believes ideal for people with high blood pressure.

For a long time, doctors have wanted Americans to lower their salt intake. January's newsletter will continue looking at salt in our diet. In the meantime, THINK taste buds, THINK savoring what we eat! Thanksgiving is on the way!! Go lightly on the salt! Have a joyful gathering with friends and loved ones. And, have a TASTEFUL dinner!
